Our goals are best defined in the mission statement of the HKVCA, and are as follows:

This Association aims to perpetuate the memory of the surviving Veterans, Hong Kong Veterans of Canada, and to ensure the welfare of their spouses, and Hong Kong Veteran's widows by:

- Enrolling children, issuance, and friends of the Hong Kong Veterans in a nationwide organization
- Maintaining a comprehensive address database of the Hong Kong Veterans and widows
- Ensuring that regular, periodic, personal contact is made with these Veterans to establish the state of their well being.
- Developing relationships with the "Hong Kong family".
- Attending memorial services on the anniversary of V-J Day and Remembrance Day, wearing badges and orally proclaiming our links to the Hong Kong Veterans.
- Constantly reviewing and improving the network and procedures applied in the execution of our mandate.
- Careful planning and review, to ensure the realization of long term goals.

Attached to this newsletter, is an application form for new members who would like to join our Association. We would encourage you to pass it along to sons and daughters, grandchildren, spouses and friends of the Hong Kong Veterans. We would also encourage Commemorative members who have not paid their membership dues for 2001, to please do so. Veterans and HKVCA members will continue to be assessed \$15.00 per year for dues. The widows are automatically members of the Commemorative Association and have received a free lifetime membership.

The new Board of Directors for the British Columbia Region hopes to send out newsletters, starting in 2002 at least twice a year, and possibly quarterly. Everyone will receive these newsletters (and of course we will be asking Lionel for his help!) along with any National Commemorative newsletters that are sent out. We are also working on new membership cards. Everyone will also receive the new 2002 HKVCA decal. The new decals are very impressive and were designed by Barry Mitchell, the Treasurer for the HKVCA in Manitoba. We will be very proud to show our allegiance to the Hong Kong Veterans by placing them on our vehicles.
