A TRIBUTE TO HK VETS
On Saturday evening, December 8, the City of Campbellton unveiled a plaque and lit a Christmas tree at the park in the Civic Centre, paying tribute to Hong Kong Veterans. The City of Campbellton, under the direction and on the

initiative of Mayor Mark Ramsay, has created a magnificent plaque briefly telling the Hong Kong story.

The plaque, measuring some five feet by four feet is situated directly in front of a blue spruce tree, planted especially for the purpose and which is lit every December 8, an auspicious date for Hong Kong Veterans.

Bob Barter and I drove from New Richmond to attend the ceremony. Also present were Allison Pollock, Graham Boudreau and Henry Lyons.

After being greeted by Mayor Ramsay at the City Hall, the parade, led by a colour party from Branch 19 of the Legion, and followed by a troop of Air cadets, marching proudly, we walked to the Civic Centre where the plaque is installed. There the Mayor read a resolution of the City Council declaring the month of December "Veterans'

Month” in the City of Campbellton.

I had the honour of assisting the Honourable Roy Boudreau, speaker of the Legislative Assembly of New Brunswick, in unveiling the plaque.

Although it was a chilly evening, there was a large group of people in attendance. After the unveiling we moved inside where hot chocolate and coffee was served while Mayor Ramsay read the text of the message on the plaque.

It was a very moving ceremony. The gratitude and well-wishing of everyone you meet sometimes gets a little embarrassing, but is nonetheless appreciated. Much appreciated!

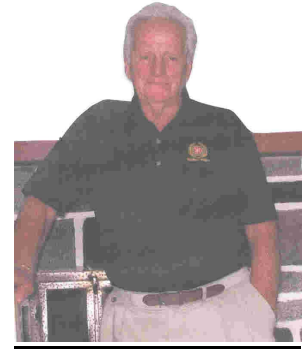
Maple Leaf Brooch
