Election of the Executive Committee

We were pleased to receive several nomination forms back from the membership. The downside is that many of those nominated cannot undertake anything additional to what they already "have on their plate".

This said, an election, per se, is not required. The good news is that we do have a full slate of officers whom will be acclaimed at the National Convention in Winnipeg this coming August.

Carol Hadley has agreed to serve her second eligible term as President.

I am hopeful this idea will expand to other secondary schools".

Lee and Graeme hope to attend and present the story of 'C' Force for the fifth consecutive year to teachers at the BC Senior Social Studies Conference this fall. The tools are provided to the teachers to enable them to teach the story in their classrooms province wide. Their presentation is powerful and leaves an impact with the teachers.

Once again we thank the Prairie Region for their efforts to provide what will undoubtedly be an outstanding HKVCA convention this August in Winnipeg.
