Memorial Wall – Design Review Approaching!



The site that we have chosen is at a busy intersection in downtown Ottawa and we needed to decide exactly where on that site our Memorial Wall would best be located. We have narrowed it down to 2 possibilities to present to the National Capitol Commission Design Review Committee, which is the next step in the approval process.

We have also been asked to consider some slight alterations to the wall design as to better tell the story behind the monument. **Jim Lennox** has prepared some sketches including a wavy look to the wall in order to meet the “artistic concept”, which is required. He will be 'fleshing' this concept out with input from the material suppliers to be ready for presentation to the NCC Design Review committee on December 17th.

The site will be enhanced by the use of China black granite for the wall, then Quebec red granite and Manitoba tyndall stone for accents in the walkways; fragrant plantings to bring in the concept of the name Hong Kong (which means “Fragrant Harbour”) and drifts of tall grasses to simulate waves of the South China Sea and the prairies. All of this will all aid in the visual aspect of this phenomenal memorial in its prominent location in Ottawa.

We have approached DST Consulting Engineers to do some drill holes to determine the foundation design for the wall as well as helping in the decision of which of the 2 locations on the site would be better.

We will start getting estimates for the extra landscaping that has been incorporated into these new concepts by approaching companies with the prospect of donating material, nursery items, etc and paying for the labour.

We hope to be ordering the wall material early in the New Year to be ready for construction to begin in the spring. So far we are close to being on target with our scheduling.

In the meantime we have heard from the representative of the Canadian Chamber of Commerce in Macau, **Tony Atherton**, and **Tony Banham** in Hong Kong that there are some ceremonies to be held in Macau and Hong Kong in December regarding the Battle of Hong Kong. They are focusing on the Canadian contingent, which they hope will result in donations being made to the Wall. We have sent them the brochure in English and Chinese to aid in their efforts.

Thanks to all the Regions and members that have continued to support the Wall project we have just passed \$125,000 with promises of more in the New Year.

That’s it for now we will keep you informed of developments. -

This most charming lady wanted to share with all of us the value of reading your mail and paying attention to subjects that might affect you. In this instance, Agnes had read that federal government assistance could be

provided to individuals in veteran's families who have health issues and who could provide medical verification. Agnes thought that she had read about this in one of the HKVCA newsletters when in fact it came direct from Veterans Affairs Canada, but nonetheless, she followed up. Agnes' daughter Donna has MS and together they prepared the necessary documentation and submitted it along with the doctor's report. Bingo! Donna now receives a monthly pension from VAC due to her MS condition. The family is most grateful for this assistance and wants everyone to know that HK children with a handicap might be eligible for similar help. You can write Veterans Affairs Canada, P.O. Wreaths were laid across British Columbia on Remembrance Day by 3 HK vets and 8 HKVCA members at 10 cenotaphs. **Aubrey Flegg** was interviewed after the Nov. 11 ceremony at the cenotaph in Kelowna by Global TV News. The short piece (approx. 45 seconds) aired on Global throughout BC on both the 6pm and 11pm news on the 11th. **Betty Waldenberger**, his long time companion, was sitting at his side.

He said, "Mr. Gerrard, you may not remember me from Government House." Gerry immediately said, "I do remember you. You held the door open for me." I told them all about the HK vets of Canada and the HKVCA and The Memorial Wall using the PowerPoint presentation I had created just for the occasion. The last two slides were pictures of Gerry and Ev at the Cenotaph on Remembrance Day two days earlier and a picture of our HKVCA wreath. The VGS members were enthralled with the HK vets story. Following my presentation, **Jim Trick** gave them a tour of our website homepage. He did a wonderful job. It was followed by a question and answer

period, which involved Jim, Gerry and myself. It was a wonderful evening.

On Saturday, November 22nd, we attended the Memorial Tribute for **Will Allister** in Vancouver. **Eileen Cambon** and her daughter Marie, **June Naylor** and her son **Lee, Murray and Lucy Doull** and myself were in attendance. We believe he will do an excellent job and we are very pleased to have him on board as a member of the BC team. Lee is already making arrangements to speak about the story of 'C' Force at the Legion and high schools in his hometown of Hope.

Ontario Offerings

We've had quite an eventful time in Ontario since our last newsletter! Here are the highlights.

During October we held five Saturday luncheons around the province. The idea was to hold several regional meetings rather than one central one. In total we had about 85 attendees, which was a 70% increase over the last province-wide meeting we held. We had a good mix of Vets, widows and members, who seem to enjoy themselves. I expect we'll do this again!

If it's November, it must be OHASSTA -- the Ontario high school history teachers' conference. Once again **Pat Turcotte** had a booth, and talked to and distributed information to a large number of very interested teachers.

We've been working hard to get closer ties with the Chinese-Canadian community. To that end, in September we participated in a seminar at the Richard Charles Lee Canada Hong Kong Library at the University of Toronto. A number of panellists, including **Flash Clayton, George MacDonell** and Senator Vivienne Poy discussed their experiences in Hong Kong 1941-1945. **Ken Skelton** prepared a fabulous display of memorabilia which is still at the Library and still being viewed by students and visiting scholars (mostly from Hong Kong and China).

In early November we ran a workshop at the ALPHA conference (ALPHA is the Association for Learning and Preserving WW II History in Asia)

about the Hong Kong Story. We also worked with a Chinese church organization in Toronto to present a remembrance ceremony and fundraising concert for the Memorial Wall. We got a lot of publicity in the Chinese-language media (did you know that Chinese is Canada's 3rd most-spoken language?) for this terrific event.

I should also mention that I was delighted to receive a Remembrance Day card addressed to all Ontario members from **Terry Kwok** of Calgary, who was instrumental in organizing the Chinese-Canadian community's extensive involvement in our 2007 Calgary Convention.

I want to make special mention of one of our members: **Ron McGuire**. As many of you know, Ron puts in a tremendous amount of work of behalf of the HKVCA. He has studied the topic of the Battle of Hong Kong extensively, has built up an impressive collection of memorabilia and spends a good deal of time preparing and presenting presentations. He has also been instrumental in having 10 HK Vets inducted into the Canadian Veterans Hall of Valour. Many of our members devote similar efforts to the HKVCA, but what makes Ron unique is that he has no direct family connection to a HK Vet. He does all this simply because he finds it interesting. In recognition of this, Ontario Region is pleased to have awarded Ron an Honorary Membership in the HKVCA. Please congratulate him next time you see him!

The momentum continues to build for the Memorial Wall in Ottawa. As you've seen elsewhere in this newsletter, we are continuing to raise funds for this terrific project. Please continue to solicit donations from your friends and neighbours for this very worthy cause!
